When betting on the spread, you're betting on a team to either win by a certain point margin, or a team to lose by a certain margin (or win outright).

The spread is the great equalizer in sports betting.

As mentioned, home-field advantage is a real thing.

Monitoring the health of the quarterback isn't enough.

So, take that newfound knowledge of spread betting and give it the old college

try (responsibly, of course).

How does betting on NFL point spreads work? In NFL point spread betting, the favorite team needs to win by a set amount of points for the bettor to cash in on their wager.

The bartenders were making 30,000 per summer in 2002, the bar backs were making 15,000 per summer, the shot guys and girls were making 10,000, as were the beer tub guys.

How To Bet On NFL & College Football Point Spreads

The favorite will have a "minus" in front of their ATS betting line, as in

(-3).

Payoff on an ATS bet is almost always 50/50 minus the "vig" or fee to the house.

Point spreads can fluctuate as bookies react to the action.

If the New England Patriots happen to have a rare "+" next to their name, for instance, bettors will tend to pick the Patriots and bookies will likely

tilt in the other direction.

Another popular gridiron wager is point total, or Over/Under.

You will often see these listed short-hand as "O/U."
